

WINSOR TOWNSHIP BOARD MEETING

March 6, 2018

The regular meeting of the Winsor Township Board was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by John P. Kohr, Supervisor.

Present: Robin Buschlen, Nancy Heck, John P. Kohr, David McCormick, John Walsh, Nick Pavlechek, Fire Chief, and Seth Stapleton of the Huron County Tribune..

The pledge of allegiance was given.

A motion was made by, Robin Buschlen supported by Nancy Heck, to close the regular meeting and to open the Public Hearing to review the proposed budget for the year ended March 31, 2019 and to discuss the millage rate of 1.2154 to support the budget. The motion carried.

John Walsh distributed February 28, 2018 financial statements and the proposed budgets for the General, Road, and Cemetery Funds for the year ended March 31, 2019. The board reviewed the financial statements and budgets. A motion was made by David McCormick supported by Robin Buschlen, to close the Public Hearing and to open the regular meeting. The motion carried.

A motion was made by John Walsh, supported by Nancy Heck, to adopt the proposed budgets for the year ended March 31, 2019 and the General Fund millage rate of 1.2154 to support the budget, (the same rate as last year). The motion carried .

The minutes of the regular meeting of the Winsor Township Board, held February 6, 2018 had been mailed to each board member. There being no additions or corrections the minutes were approved as presented.

A motion was made by David McCormick, supported by Nancy Heck to approve the bills paid during the month of February 2018 and to authorize payment of the March 2018 bills of \$19,904.67. The motion carried.
