

# WINSOR TOWNSHIP BOARD MEETING SEPTEMBER 5, 2023

The regular meeting of the Winsor Township Board was called to order by Matt Reibling, Supervisor, at 5:00 pm, in the township boardroom.

Present: David Armbruster, Nancy Heck, David McCormick, Matt Reibling and John Walsh. Also present: Nick Pavlichek, Fire Chief, Todd Talaski, Huron County Commissioner and Andrew Johnson from Apple Blossom Wind Farms.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Todd Talaski reported that the flooding damage repair to the county building was nearing completion. Remodeling of the new MSU building is on going and the Caseville Road bridge repair should be completed by the end of October.

Andrew Johnson reported that his company is in the sixth year of it's programmed maintenance cycle and no major problems have surfaced.

The minutes of the last regular meeting had been distributed to each board member. There being no additions or corrections, a motion was made by Nancy Heck, supported by David Armbruster, to accept the minutes. The motion carried.

After review, a motion was made by David McCormick, supported by David Armbruster, to authorize payment of the September 2023 bills of \$ 14,005.

John Walsh presented journal entries, check register, bank reconciliation and financial statements for the General Fund and the CDRS cash funds, [Certificate of Deposit Registry Service]. A motion was made by David McCormick, supported by David Armbruster, to approve the financial information. The motion carried.

Nick Pavlichek, Fire Chief, reported on Department activities noting that the department has found two candidates, both of whom are certified fire fighters, to add to the departments roll. Adam Linzner and Derek Kildoe. A motion was made by John Walsh, supported by Nancy Heck, to add the recommended fire fighters to the department. The motion carried.

A motion was made by John Walsh, supported by Nancy Heck, that because of the delays in cooperation from township taxpayers, that the completion date of the township’s reappraisal of property, by KMA Associates, be extended for one year. The motion carried.


John Walsh presented a letter of resignation, to be effective on October 31, 2023. A motion was made by David McCormick, supported, with regret, by David Armbruster, to accept the resignation. The motion carried.

The Chairman stated, after discussion, that Winsor Township will place ads in the two local newspapers requesting resumes be submitted by September 21,2023, from qualified electors of the township,to fill the remaining term of the Clerk. A special meeting will be held, on Tuesday September 26, 2023 at 5:00 pm, in the township hall. Qualified applicants, may, be called to be interviewed at that meeting.

A discussion, then ensued, about the attempt, by the state, to circumvent local authority in issuing “sand and gravel permits”. The concern of the board

is, that if the state tries to circumvent local authority on this issue, where will it end?

There being no further business, a motion was made by David Armbruster, supported by David McCormick, to adjourn at 5:50 pm. The motion carried.
